

Bradford YOT Achieves PSA Target

Youth Justice Bulletin - April 2009

The government has set national re-offending targets and the PSA is a further demanding stretch target. The target (set over 3 years) has been met resulting in improved outcomes for young offenders and fewer victims of crime.

New Re-offending Target

(Lower Better)

Pre-Court	23.1%	25.4%	- 2.3%
First Tier	41.8%	50%	- 8.2%
Community Sentences	64.3%	68.7%	- 4.4%
Custody	75%	93%	- 18%

New Re-offending Target

Bradford is achieving better than both its family and Yorkshire averages

2008 cohort
after 6-months

Yorkshire	63
Family	67
England Average	60

Based on cohort January-March and frequency of convicted offences committed by young offenders. Started in 2008 and reported quarterly.

Bradford was the only YOT in Phase 4 inspection in England to score 4 (Excellent) in outcomes with young offenders.
